- Heb 11:1 Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen.
- John 3:8 The wind bloweth where it listeth, and thou hearest the sound thereof, but canst not tell whence it cometh, and whither it goeth: so is every one that is born of the Spirit.
- John 20:24 But Thomas, one of the twelve, called Didymus, was not with them when Jesus came.
- 25 The other disciples therefore said unto him, We have seen the Lord. But he said unto them Except I shall see in his hands the print of the nails, and put my finger into the print of the nails, and thrust my hand into his side, I will not believe.
- 2Co 4:8 We are troubled on every side, yet not distressed; (how that) we are perplexed, but not in despair;
- 9 (how that we are) Persecuted, but not forsaken; (and how that we are) cast down, but not destroyed;
- 2Co 12: 7 And lest I (Paul) should be exalted above measure through the abundance of the revelations, there was given to me a **thorn in the flesh**, the messenger of Satan to buffet me, lest I should be exalted above measure.
- 8 For this thing I besought the Lord thrice, that it might depart from me.
- 9 And he said unto me, My grace is sufficient for thee: for my strength is made perfect in weakness. (and after being told NO Paul then replies) Most gladly therefore will I rather glory in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me.
- James 4:6 But he giveth more grace. Wherefore he saith, God **resisteth the proud**, but giveth grace unto the humble.
- 7 Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you.
- 8 Draw nigh to God, and he will draw nigh to you. Cleanse your hands, ye sinners; and purify your hearts, ye double minded.
- 9 Be afflicted, and mourn, and weep: let your laughter be turned to mourning, and your joy to heaviness.
- 10 **Humble yourselves** in the sight of the Lord, and he shall lift you up.
- Ps 121:2 My help cometh from the LORD, which made heaven and earth.
- Luke 17:5 And the apostles said unto the Lord, Increase our faith.
- James 1:2 My brethren, count it all joy when ye fall into divers (many or different types of) temptations;

- 3 Knowing this, that the trying (testing) of your faith worketh (or works out) patience (which is endurance).
- 4 But let patience have her perfect work, that ye may be perfect and entire, wanting nothing.
