

Heb 11:1 Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen.

John 3:8 The wind bloweth where it listeth, and thou hearest the sound thereof, but canst not tell whence it cometh, and whither it goeth: so is every one that is born of the Spirit.

John 20:24 But Thomas, one of the twelve, called Didymus, was not with them when Jesus came.

25 The other disciples therefore said unto him, We have seen the Lord. But he said unto them **Except I shall see in his hands the print of the nails, and put my finger into the print of the nails, and thrust my hand into his side, I will not believe.**

2Co 4:8 We are troubled on every side, yet not distressed; (how that) we are perplexed, but not in despair;

9 (how that we are) Persecuted, but not forsaken; (and how that we are) cast down, but not destroyed;

2Co 12: 7 And lest I (Paul) should be exalted above measure through the abundance of the revelations, there was given to me a **thorn in the flesh**, the messenger of Satan to buffet me, lest I should be exalted above measure.

8 For this thing I besought the Lord thrice, that it might depart from me.

9 And he said unto me, My grace is sufficient for thee: for my strength is made perfect in weakness. (and after being told NO – Paul then replies) Most gladly therefore will I rather glory in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me.

James 4:6 But he giveth more grace. Wherefore he saith, God **resisteth the proud**, but giveth grace unto the humble.

7 Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you.

8 Draw nigh to God, and he will draw nigh to you. Cleanse your hands, ye sinners; and purify your hearts, ye double minded.

9 Be afflicted, and mourn, and weep: let your laughter be turned to mourning, and your joy to heaviness.

10 **Humble yourselves** in the sight of the Lord, and he shall lift you up.

Ps 121:2 My help cometh from the LORD, which made heaven and earth.

Luke 17:5 And the apostles said unto the Lord, Increase our faith.

James 1:2 My brethren, count it all joy when ye fall into divers (many or different types of) temptations;

3 Knowing this, that the trying (testing) of your faith worketh (or works out) patience (which is endurance).

4 But let patience have her perfect work, that ye may be perfect and entire, wanting nothing.
